Future Farmers of America Remember?

The FFA was instituted into law in 1917 by Senator and Rep. Hughes and Smith from Georgia. The Future Homemakers of America was included in the same law. FFA was part of Vocational Agriculture that was first introduced to Summit Station in the 1930s. Vo-Ag teachers were Curtis Jones, Bill Stuckey, Mr. Griffith, Paul Raines, Roger Parks, Rick Wells and Tad Dodderer. It was no longer offered at Licking Heights after the 1991 school year..

Vo-Ag was the teaching of agriculture, crops, forestry, livestock, livestock judging and farm management. As farming became less and less in this area, parliamentary procedure, public speaking and other skills were taught. Some who made State Farmers from Summit and Licking Heights were; Leo Fravel and Bill Foster in 1944; Bob Lynd, Butch Haegle and Paul Gieseck in 1964; Cathy Bob, Carol, Christy and Tony Fravel in the 1970s; and Jay Baird in the 1980s. The Vo-Ag building at Summit burned and the historical records were lost. So, please forgive us if the list is at all incomplete.

Mr. Beam was the Toastmaster, Bob Smallwood presented the yearend results, and Gary Stagg presented the "outlook". Mr. Craig represented the Athletics, Dr. James Hull was the speaker, Mr. Shaw presented the sport Letters, and Mr. Harper the Honor Awards.

Football: They had an 8-1 season, Licking County Champs (undefeated), and Co-Champs of the Mid-Buckeye League.

Basketball: They had a 18-2 season, Licking County Champs (undefeated), and Co-Champs of the Mid-Buckeye League.

Track and Baseball stats were not complete!

Football Honors: All County; Clarence Glover, Bill Giffin, Gary Burns, Steve Carr, Dick Green, Robert Smallwood. All Mid-Buckeye; Dick Green, Bill Giffin and Robert Smallwood.

Basketball Honors: All County and All Mid-Buckeye; Martin Sunderland and Roger Springer.

School Records: These were ALL "a first" for the school; Mid-Buckeye Football and Basketball Champs, Undisputed Basketball League Champs, and first county school to win three consecutive county Basketball Tournaments. Personal records were Bill Giffin broke the shot put record 40'7", Mike Harrison broke the discus record 138' and Mike's 100 yd. dash record 10.1 seconds.
